The next Ordinary Council Meeting is scheduled to be held on Tuesday, 15 December at 4:00pm. WORKS UPDATES

Kerb Painting

The outside crew have been working hard to beautify the CBD by updating the kerb paint along Barrack and Bates Streets. Approximately 1000m of kerb was painted during the course of this project. The Shire would like to thank the community and local businesses for their positive feedback about the painting, and the outside crew for their efforts—it looks fantastic!

Roads

The outside crew have also been spending their time on a number of projects including Summer Grading, and the construction of Burke Road. Work has also recently commenced on Clarke Road in the South Burracoppin area.

Secondary Freight Route

The Shire of Merredin will receive \$1.5million this year via the Secondary Freight Route Network model, with additional funding over the next 4-5 years, for the upgrade of the Merredin-Narembeen Road. This year approximately 4.5kms of work will be undertaken at the Narembeen end of the road.

Central Wheatbelt Visitor Centre Lawn

The lawn at the Central Wheatbelt Vistors Centre has been receiving some TLC over the last few weeks. The engineering team has been out on the lawn from 6:00am fertilising the grass and watering it to ensure it is healthy and vibrant.

Have you heard of the Sketchbook Project? Each year, Propel sends sketchbooks to participants across WA and encourages them to fill the books with designs, stories or drawings. The sketchbooks can be cut, painted or inked – anything creative goes. The youth of WA are invited to tell their own stories, in their own way using the sketchbook.

All the sketchbooks received will be displayed in the State Library of WA as part of Youth Week WA KickstART Festival. After the festival the sketchbooks become part of a travelling show visiting regional and suburban libraries.

Anyone, aged from 12 to 26, who wishes to participate should go to the Propel website <u>https://www.propel.org.au</u> to register. Select Merredin Library as your hub. You will be notified by email or text when your sketchbook is ready for collection – this should be in mid-January.

Fill your sketchbook however you like. Can't paint or draw? Maybe write a poem, or an intricate math formula – anything goes. You can share your progress online to help inspire others. Once you are finished return and submit your sketchbook, either directly to Propel or by 15 March to Merredin Library so it can be sent off to Perth in time.

The Travelling Sketchbook Exhibition will be on tour from June 2021 to January 2022. In February 2022, all Sketchbooks will be returned to their creators.

Fight the Bite!

In Western Australia, mosquitoes can transmit Ross River virus, Barmah Forest virus, Kunjin virus and the potentially fatal Murray Valley encephalitis virus. There is currently no cure and no vaccine for any mosquito-borne disease acquired in WA. The only way to prevent infection is to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes.

Tips to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes:

- Cover Up wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can;
- Repel When outdoors and mosquitoes are present, apply insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltoluamide) or picaridin evenly to exposed skin; and
- Clean Up simple changes around your home can reduce mosquito breeding. Remove, empty or cover water-holding containers.

Mosquitoes can breed around your home. They will lay their eggs in fresh or salty water, and often in containers that hold water. Common breeding sites include pot plant drip trays, gutters, ponds, pet water bowls, old tyres, rubbish, containers and pools that are not well maintained. Tips to stop mosquitoes breeding around your home by following these simple steps:

- Empty out or discard containers and rubbish that may hold water;
- Clean out roof gutters to prevent water from pooling;
- Empty, clean and refill bird baths, stock troughs and pet water bowls at least once a week;
- Keep swimming pools properly maintained and free of debris;
- Empty wading pools at the end of each day;
- Stock backyard ponds with fish to eat mosquito larvae;
- Cover rainwater and septic tank openings, wells or other large water containers with mosquito-proof mesh; and
- Keep edges of ponds clear of vegetation.

Shire of Merredin Successful for RAC Grant Funding

The Shire of Merredin and RAC are partnering to deliver a Public Piazza Pilot Project as part of RAC's Reconnect WA initiative. The project will see a four-month closure of part of Barrack Street in Merredin to create a 'public piazza' with features including:

- Parklets which include dining and public seating areas;
- Vibrant street art;
- Catenary/Festoon lighting;
- Greenery including sensory gardens;
- Play and event spaces; and
- Umbrella's and other shading.

The purpose of this pilot piazza is to act as a catalyst for the imminent future improvements to our CBD and test ideas and options for the final CBD redevelopment design.

"The Shire Team has been working incredibly hard on the new Strategic Community Plan, including pursuing projects that the community indicated were a priority during the RESET. RECOVER. REGENERATE. engagement workshops," Shire President Julie Flockart said.

"The [piazza] project aims to inspire collaboration within the community and support our local business community by increasing flow of pedestrians down our main street."

RAC's Reconnect WA initiative was created to help revitalise streets and public spaces to better connect people and places. Merredin is one of eight successful Local Government's chosen for the first round of funding.

Temporary CEO Mark Dacombe said, "Our team is really excited to bring a taste of the CBD improvements to come. We are keen to monitor any changes in activity and interaction that this vibrant transformation will bring to our CBD."

"We're very excited to be partnering with local governments across WA to breathe new life into our communities and create vibrant places for Western Australians to interact and reconnect with one another and their local areas," said RAC Executive General Manager Advocacy and Members Patrick Walker.

Tree Removal Update

On Tuesday, 1 December, the rotten tree identified between the Military and Railway Museums was removed. The tree had significant rot making it too dangerous to remain in place due to the risk of a falling limb injuring pedestrians using the pathway.

The timber from the tree will be used by the outside crew for mulching, as well as in a sensory garden in the Public Piazza.

This financial year, the Shire will be planting an additional 360 trees.
