Scheme Water: Not Enough During Bushfire

Residents living in or near bushland are reminded to not rely on public water supplies if they plan to stay and defend their homes during a bushfire.

If you plan to stay and defend your home you must have an **independent** water supply and pumping capability. Scheme water may not be available due to damaged infrastructure, extreme demand depleting supply and pressure, or a cut to power which is used to pump water.

Locust Control Assistance Scheme

The Australian Plague Locust Assistance Scheme has been established to offer financial assistance to help rural landowners control locusts. The scheme provides a contribution of \$5 per hectare for the control of locusts with an appropriate insecticide in pastures, crops or on public amenities like ovals.

The Scheme is targeted to shires with a high level of locust activity including Gnowangerup, Jerramungup, Kulin, Lake Grace, Mukinbudin, Nungarin, Westonia and Yilgarn. The scheme may be extended to additional shires if the Department of Agriculture and Food survey teams identify areas experiencing a high level of locust activity.

Swarming locusts have the ability to cause severe and widespread damage to crops, pastures, grapevines, fruit trees and tree seedlings. The Department urges landowners to check their properties from early spring to monitor locust activity to determine if control is bushfire season by readying equipment and systems to cope with extreme conditions. Despite these efforts, it is likely there will be a reduction in water pressure, and scheme water supply tanks may run empty in the event of fire.

necessary. Tighter control on locusts early in the breeding season helps to reduce the likelihood of swarms as well as reducing the number of egg laying adults in the following year.

Landowners interested in applying for the scheme are encouraged to visit the Department of Agriculture and Food website for information on how to apply. Applications for the scheme are open until 31 January 2017, although locust control should be undertaken before 31 December to receive the contribution.

Shade Shelter for Community Area

Following a successful funding application, the Central Wheatbelt Visitor Centre recently completed the installation of an all-weather shade shelter along the footpath next to the Centre's lawn in the CBD. The need was recognised to provide community groups, residents and visitors with a functional all weather shelter. This area is increasingly popular for community events such as markets, food festivals and the annual Destination Merredin festival.

Stage 2 of the project will commence in January with the installation of bench seating as well as interpretive panels displaying historical images of the town, its attractions and after-hours visitor information. This project was made possible by funding from the Regional Visitor Centre Sustainability Grant Funding Program.
