## **Reporting Nuisance Dogs**

It is every dog owner's responsibility to ensure that their dog(s) do not bark excessively. Whilst barking is a dog's means of communication and may also alert the owner to an intruder or danger, persistent barking in a manner not considered to be normally habitual in the dog may be considered a nuisance.

If your neighbour's dog(s) is barking excessively you can complete a Nuisance Dog Form and submit to the Shire

Ranger to take action. The Ranger will issue a warning to the dog(s) owner. In most cases, this warning is enough for the owner to remedy the problem.

If the owner does not comply and the situation is not resolved you can complete a barking record. This record provides evidence of the dog's excessive barking and is required for further legal action against the owner.

## **Infant Swimming**

Infant Swim classes commenced this month at the Merredin Regional Community and Leisure Centre. The main objective of these classes is to teach water familiarisation and safety to parents and their young children using fun aquatic activities.

Early swimming classes can allow babies to exercise more muscles in the water as they are less restricted by gravity and their ability to sit or stand. Mastering water movements early gives children a head start in learning basic swimming skills, develops coordination and balance by encouraging them to move bilaterally to maintain

equilibrium under water. Doctors often recommend swimming as the exercise of choice for asthmatics; swimming stimulates less wheezing than other forms of exercise likely due to the warm, moist air around pools being less irritating to the lungs.

Learning water safety is important to protect against accidental drowning, which is the major cause of accidental deaths in children under 5.

The classes offered at Merredin Regional Community and Leisure Centre are suitable for children aged between 6 months and 5 years. The classes run over 6 weeks and are taught by Austswim qualified instructors.

## **Disability Parking Laws**

A reminder to drivers that it is against the law to park or stop in a parking area for people with disabilities unless the driver or the passenger is a person with disabilities and is displaying an ACROD sticker.

Disobeying this law is an offence and a \$300 infringement will be issued to any vehicle parked in a disabled bay failing to display an ACROD sticker

Extract from *Local Government Act 1995* - Local Law No. 8 - Parking and Parking Facilities states:

- 6.15 Stopping in a parking stall for people with disabilities
- (1) A driver shall not stop in a parking area for people with disabilities unless—
  - (a) the driver's vehicle displays an ACROD sticker; and
  - (b) either the driver or the passenger in that vehicle is a person with disabilities.


