Purpose of Report

Background

Councillors would be aware that the CEACA project is to construct a number of houses in various locations across the central eastern Wheatbelt. The project has achieved funding through Royalties for Regions in two stages totalling approximately \$22 million.

Comment

Tenders were called through WALGA in late July and closed on 22 August 2017. A total of 8 tenders were received with one being ruled ineligible. The remaining tenders were considered by an evaluation panel and a report issued by the panel through WALGA on 27 September 2017.

A special meeting of the CEACA Committee was held on Friday 29 September 2017 where the evaluation panel report was considered and the recommendation of the panel accepted unanimously.

As the minutes of the CEACA meeting were unavailable at the time this agenda was prepared a copy of the agenda for the meeting containing the adopted recommendation will be forwarded by separate email together with the evaluation panel report.
