Council elections coming up

The next local government ordinary election will be held on 21 October, 2017 with four positions on the Shire of Merredin Council being up for grabs.

Councillors represent the interests of the ratepayers and residents of the district and provide leadership and guidance to the community. They facilitate communication between the community and the Shire, and participate in the Shire's decision making process.

It's really easy for you to have your say in shaping the next Council though.

We will once again be undertaking a postal vote conducted by the WA Electoral Commission.

By making the Electoral Commissioner responsible for the election, Council can ensure that the election is conducted independently and with impartiality. Additionally, postal elections are often more convenient for electors, resulting in more people voting.

You need to be on the electoral roll, which closes at 5pm on 1 September. Pop along to **www.elections.wa.gov.au** for info on updating your enrolment details.

Could you be our next Councillor?

Have you ever wondered why Councillors make the decisions they do (or thought you could do it better)? Have you ever wanted to play a role in making the shire a better place to live?

You might be one of our next Councillors!

Nominations open on 7 September, 2017 and close at 4pm on 14 September, 2017.

If you are interested in becoming a Councillor you will need to lodge a nomination paper, in the prescribed form, with the Returning Officer during that period.

The Library was also successful in obtaining a grant to furnish the activity/meeting room and the new memorabilia/reading area of the library.


The memorabilia room will house displays of local history items as well as have photos and short recording of Tales of Times Past that will be available for people to look at and listen to.














What's on in the Wheatbelt

Q&A - Tip passes for the new financial year

Q. My tip pass wasn't with my rates notice. Where is it?

A. Tip passes haven't been included with rates notices for a number of years now.



Residential tip passes are issued to ratepayers upon payment of either the first instalment of their rates or their rates in full.

If you are renting a property, the tip pass for that property will have been sent to the ratepayer of the property. If they have not forwarded it on to you, please contact your landlord or real estate agent.
