

GARDEN WATER LEVELS LOW

With a dry summer this year the levels in the dams supplying the water for the public parks and gardens in Merredin have fallen very low. Currently the Shire is monitoring these levels closely and in the near future may have to scale back the watering of these areas. Unfortunately this means that these public gardens will start to look very dry if this occurs. The areas that would be affected will be Roy Little Park, Apex Park, Barrack St garden beds and the Great Eastern Highway garden beds. In the event that this occurs the Shire will manage the situation as best as it is able to. Any garden beds that dry out will have to wait for rain before regular watering can resume.

SPRAY SEAL & ASPHALT PROGRAMS

At Counsil's meeting on Tuesday, 19 February, Council voted to award the spray seal and asphalt programs for 2018/19. These programs will see Merredin's road infrastructure receive important upgrades to ensure their longevity.

Both programs are a continuation of ongoing works commenced last financial year. The roads set to receive asphalting as part of the budget program this financial year will include the Barrack St spur (in front of Petticoat Lane), Caridi Cl, Cassia St, Council Ave, Dolton Way, Todd St, Hay St and Mary St.

The roads set to receive spray seal upgrades this financial year will include Nokanning West Rd, Burracoppin Campion Rd, Hines Hill North Rd and Hines Hill South Rd.
