Hi Scott

Thank you for your email and our subsequent meeting and conversation. I have spoken with representatives from Landgate, Department of lands (DPLH) and Shires Executive Manager Engineering Services Mr Mike Hudson in relation to your enquiry.

I confirm that the land that you have expressed an interest in which adjoins the Western boundary of your property located at 20 Pioneer Road, Merredin, and is allocated Polygon ID Number 1299701 is currently owned by the state of WA and is a designated road.

order to purchase the land in question the following process would need to be undertaken;

- 1. You would need to formally approach the Shire of Merredin stating your interest in and reasons for purchasing the said land and seeking support from the Shire of Merredin for formal closure of the road.
- 2. If the Shire of Merredin Council supports your request it would need to (subject to compliance with Section 53 of the Land Administration Act and Regulation 9 of the land Administration Regulations) request the Minister responsible for administration of the said Act to close the road.
- 3. Prior to making such a request of the Minister, the Shire of Merredin would need to formally resolve to approach the Minister requesting the road closure and advertise the fact for public comment for a period of 35 days, following which it would need to formally consider all submissions before finalizing the matter.
- 4. Once the request is received by the Minister, according to the DLPH it takes anywhere from 9-12 months to close the road, at which time they would contact yourself with respect to a sum of money that they believe the land is worth and you then have an option to purchase the land, if you decline the purchase price the land is retained by the State as unallocated crown land.

As previously indicated the Shire of Merredin does not wish to incur any costs with respect to this process as the purchase of the land benefits yourself personally and should not be subsidised by funds of the Shires ratepayers. As such all costs associated with processing your request by Council officers, as well as costs of advertising would need to be borne by yourself.

# 9. Local government request to close road permanently (Act s. 58(2)), requirements for

For the purposes of preparing and delivering under section 58(2) of the Act a request to the Minister to close a road permanently, a local government must include with the request -

- (a) written confirmation that the local government has resolved to make the request, details of the date when the relevant resolution was passed and any other information relating to that resolution that the Minister may require; and
- (b) sketch plans showing the location of the road and the proposed future disposition of the land comprising the road after it has been closed; and
- (c) copies of any submissions relating to the request that, after complying with the requirement to publish the relevant notice of motion under section 58(3) of the Act, the local government has received, and the local government's comments on those submissions; and
- (d) a copy of the relevant notice of motion referred to in paragraph (c); and
- (e) any other information the local government considers relevant to the Minister's consideration of the request; and
- (f) written confirmation that the local government has complied with section 58(2) and (3) of the Act.

- 58. Closing roads
- (1) When a local government wishes a road in its district to be closed permanently, the local government may, subject to subsection (3), request the Minister to close the road.
- (2) When a local government resolves to make a request under subsection (1), the local government must in accordance with the regulations prepare and deliver the request to the Minister.
- (3) A local government must not resolve to make a request under subsection (1) until a period of 35 days has elapsed from the publication in a newspaper circulating in its district of notice of motion for that resolution, and the local government has considered any objections made to it within that period concerning the proposals set out in that notice.
- (4) On receiving a request delivered to him or her under subsection (2), the Minister may, if he or she is satisfied that the relevant local government has complied with the requirements of subsections (2) and (3) —
- (a) by order grant the request; or
- (b) direct the relevant local government to reconsider the request, having regard to such matters as he or she thinks fit to mention in that direction; or
- (c) refuse the request.
- (5) If the Minister grants a request under subsection (4) —
- (a) the road concerned is closed on and from the day on which the relevant order is registered; and
- (b) any rights suspended under section 55(3)(a) cease to be so suspended.
- (6) When a road is closed under this section, the land comprising the former road —
- (a) becomes unallocated Crown land; or
- (b) if a lease continues to subsist in that land by virtue of section 57(2), remains Crown land.
