Background:

A termite inspection of the Railway Museum was undertaken recently by Local Pest Control as part of Council's building maintenance obligations.

A copy of the report from Local Pest Control is contained as **Attachment 10.1A.**

Regrettably, live termite activity was identified in the "Refreshment/Dining Room" building.

Legal Implications:

Section 6.8 of the Local Government Act 1995 states that local government is not to incur expenditure unless authorised in advance by resolution by *absolute majority*.

Budget Implications:

Whilst \$20,000 was allocated for capital works at the Railway Museum, only a nominal amount of \$1550 was allocated to maintenance of the Merredin Heritage Precinct.

Two separate quotes for various degrees of termite treatment of the affected buildings were provided by Local Pest Control.

- Colony eradication \$12,000, plus drilling costs (est. \$3,500)
- Baiting system \$2,784

3.22.10

The building maintenance reserve has a current balance of \$60,915.

Comment:

Staff joined the proprietor of Local Pest Control for a visual inspection of the affected area and confirmed the termite activity.

The colony eradication treatment comes complete with a guarantee from the manufacturer, with Local Pest Control working under a specific contract to install the system. The major drawback of this system is the requirement for core drilling into the hot mixed platform at two metre intervals, then hand drilling to enable the correct installation of the termite traps.

Whilst capped with a stainless steel cover this would have a detrimental affect on the appearance of the railway platform in the adjacent area.

The baiting system is not 100% guaranteed to completely remove all termite colonies from the general area, however will destroy the major nests and individual areas of termite activity.

Background:

Staff have conducted various meetings and negotiations with Ms Lee Steel of Solfame Pty Ltd (the owner) concerning the establishment of a commercial storage business at Lot 31 Mitchell Street, Merredin (the property).

A site plan and aerial photograph of the property can be seen as **Attachment 10.2A.**

A written submission from the owner seeking approval in principal from Council can be seen as **Attachment 10.2B.**

A graphic representation of the commercial storage buildings and proposed fencing can be seen as **Attachment 10.2C.**

A floor plan and elevations of the proposed buildings can be seen as **Attachment 10.2D.**

The property is immediately to the west of the Newfields building at Lot 36 Mitchell Street which is also under the ownership of Solfame Pty Ltd.

Legal Implications:

Lot 31 Mitchell Street, Merredin is zoned "Shop" in accordance with the Shire of Merredin Town Planning Scheme No.1 (the scheme).

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

A commercial storage facility is a "use not listed" within the zoning and development table of the scheme.

Clause 2.2.4 of the Scheme states that –

"if a particular use is not listed in the use classes, and it is not included in the general terms of any use class, then the Council shall, upon application to it determine either:

- That the use shall be prohibited within the Scheme area; or
- That the use may be permitted within one or more of the zones within the Scheme area.

The Council shall, in the latter case, decide which of the use symbols shall apply and may impose any conditions or development standards it deems fit."

The relevant use symbols of the scheme are listed below -

"P" permitted

"PS" not permitted unless special approval given by Council subject to conditions being complied with

"AP" not permitted unless special approval given after advertising "IP" not permitted unless it is incidental to a predominant use as determined by Council

Under the provisions of the draft Local Planning Strategy, Lot 31 Mitchell Street is to be included in the "town centre" zone, which encompasses the main Merredin central business district.

Any development on the property is bound to comply with the Planning and Development Act 2005 and the Shire of Merredin Town Planning Scheme No.1.

Budget Implications:

Town Planning fees are levied on applications as per Councils Schedule of Fees and Charges and under the provisions of the Town Planning (Local Government Planning Fees) Regulations 2000.

Comment:

The policy statement of the zoning and development table relevant to the "Shop" zone indicates that the area should be used primarily for retail shopping. The proximity of the Landmark operations at Lots 12, 32 and 38 Mitchell Street however creates a precedent for non-retail development in the area.

Council's Town Planning Scheme No.1 does not refer to, or accommodate, a commercial storage business in any of the zones. It is generally felt however that such business would be most appropriately located in the "Light Industry", "General Industry" or "Showroom" zones.

TUES 17 OCTOBER 2006

Discussions with the owner indicate that it is proposed to locate the storage buildings at the rear (south) of Lot 31 and to have such buildings screened from view using "Neetascreen" or similar "colorbond" solid sheet fencing.

It is also proposed to locate the storage buildings at the rear of Lot 31 to enable future development of the property along the Mitchell Street frontage at a later date.

The buildings are proposed to be clad in colorbond sheeting.

In her submission, Ms Steel suggests a collaborative approach to address the stormwater issues aligned to the laneway between Barrack and Mitchell Streets. Discussions with Council's Manager of Works indicate that no allocation for drainage upgrades in this area has been made in the 2006/2007 budget.

Whilst probably increasing the volume of traffic using the laneway, the proposal should not result in vehicular obstructions as all vehicles accessing the storage units will do so from within Lot 31.

This proposal has been in direct response to the shortage of commercial storage space within the Merredin townsite and Council's policy restricting the use of sea containers in the central business district.

Prior to formally considering an application for planning consent for this development Council may wish to advertise in accordance with the provisions of the scheme.

Background:

Councillors may be aware of the Wheatbelt Relay for Life, to be conducted at the Merredin Recreation Ground on the long weekend, 3-4 March 2007.

The Relay for Life is the major fundraising event of the Cancer Council of WA and is now run in five locations throughout Western Australia. The inaugural Wheatbelt Relay for Life was at the Merredin Recreation Ground in March 2005.

The event attracted 25 teams in 2005 with over 300 people participating. It was truly a regional community event involving young children and older people and people representing many Wheatbelt towns, all participating together. In all over \$55,000 was raised for the Cancer Council of WA.

The Relay for Life is a team's event relay whereby members of each team ensure a team baton is constantly moving around a designated track for a 24 hour period. Emphasis is placed on participation in the Relay, rather than performance, with the prime objective being fund raising for the Cancer Council of WA in a fun atmosphere.

Cr Neil Hooper and the Manager of Development Services are all volunteer members of the local committee who are organising the event in conjunction with the Cancer Council of WA.

At its Ordinary meeting in December 2004 Council resolved (**CMRef 27745**) to provide in-kind support to the Wheatbelt Relay for Life.

The Wheatbelt Relay for Life Committee is seeking Council's support of the event. A letter of request from the Committee can be seen at **Attachment 10.3A** The Committee acknowledges the tremendous contribution Council made to the 2005 event, and subject to Council's agreement to provide the same level of in kind support for the 2007 event, will recognise the Shire of Merredin as a major sponsor of the Wheatbelt Relay for Life.

Legal Implications:

All insurances and public liability for the event are covered by the Cancer Council of WA

Budget Implications:

The use of Council's Recreation Ground and surrounds, facilities and services will result in a net imposition on Council's budget, and accordingly the committee is seeking an in-kind contribution for such.

Areas identified as a cost to Council include –

- Allocation for the preparation of the oval including mowing and line marking and delineation (Curator).
- Sole use of the Merredin Recreation Ground and Merredin Regional Community and Leisure Centre by the Wheatbelt Relay for Life for the period 3-4 March 2007.
- Use of lighting at the Recreation Ground for at least an 11 hour period 3-4 March 2007.
- Electrical checks of installations and outlets prior to commencement of event
- Allocation for additional cleaning and re-stocking of amenities on 4 March 2007 (Cleaner)
- General assistance in the setting up of facilities (tables/chairs), erection of tents and other shade structures (Works staff)

It is estimated that Council's contribution to this event will total approximately \$5,000 with such costs allocated to areas such as recreation grounds maintenance, recreation buildings (including maintenance and cleaning), parks and gardens within budget constraints.

Comment:

The businesses and residents of Merredin and surrounding districts responded very well to the inaugural Wheatbelt for Life and the 2007 event promises to bring more people into and increase the exposure for the Shire of Merredin.

The Committee hopes to increase the regional focus of the event and secure the involvement of all Shires within the area, ultimately welcoming non-Merredin residents into the Shire.

At the May 2006 Business and Community Development Committee meeting it was agreed to investigate the purchase of Lot 160 King Street which at that time was for sale. Diagram at **Attachment 10.5A.**

Contact was made with Landmark Real Estate Agent Natalie Cook, however an offer had already been submitted and therefore no further action occurred.

Since then the offer has been withdrawn and there have been issues with other offers that lead to the owners taking the property off the market.

Through enquiries with the Department of Planning and Infrastructure it was identified that six properties believed to be Crown Grants vested to the Shire, had in fact had new Certificate of Titles registered and are freehold properties, one being Lot 159 King Street, Merredin.

Lot 159 King Street has a drainage easement that limits the size of any development on the property.

This information was presented to the Business and Community Development Committee October 2006 meeting (Refer Item 9.3), resulting in a recommendation to Council – that pending the availability, Council purchase Lot 160 King Street.

By owning both properties, it would enable Council to consider different development options.

Country Housing Authority Grant Application

Application was made to the Country Housing Authority to construct a second dwelling on Lot 69 Coronation Street. The Shire successfully applied to the CHA in 2004 for a grant of \$50,000 to construct a professional residence which is now occupied by the Recreation Centre Manager.

The CHA informed the Shire was unsuccessful in it's application on this occasion. The application did meet all relevant criteria however the grant scheme was heavily over-subscribed which lead to a considerable number of unsuccessful applications. The CHA Director confirmed the programme will continue in 2007 and encouraged the Shire of Merredin to reapply at that time. The financial implication resulting from this outcome will be considered in the half year budget review.

Club Development Officers Scheme

Application to the Department of Sport and Recreation recently informed the Shire was unsuccessful in it's application to secure grant funding for a Club Development Officer to be placed within the staffing structure of the Merredin Regional Community and Leisure Centre.

It was intended the Club Development Officer would augment the role of the Recreation Centre Manager by assisting established clubs and groups (including non-profit organisations) improve the way in which they manage their administrative affairs, provide training opportunities, encourage increased participation and promote succession planning. The grant scheme fully funded the salary of an officer, up to a three year period.

Successful local government areas funded under the grant scheme include: Geraldton, Greenough, Bunbury, Gnowangerup, Kojonup, Broomehill, Tambellup, Koorda, Nungarin, Mukinbudin, Mount Marshall, Trayning, Westonia, Wyalkatchem, Joondalup, Wanneroo, Kwinana, Cockburn, Coolgardie, Cranbrook, Denmark, Plantagenet, Wyndham East Kimberley, Halls Creek, Canning, Gosnells, Rockingham, Broome, West Arthur, Irwin, Swan, Bayswater, South Perth and Victoria Park.

It is disappointing to note a number of metropolitan and major regional local governments were successful in their applications, many having the financial wherewithal to appoint Club Development Officers without need of government funding assistance. It is also recognised that NEWROC Councils were successful in their joint application.

The Shire of Merredin has been reassured the application met all criteria, however the scheme was over-subscribed and the Shire has been encouraged to reapply for funding at a future time.

Council was also advised that staff have submitted an application for Sport and Recreation funding to reticulate the main recreation oval in 2007/2008.

The Western Australian Local Government Association writes to seek Council support for a campaign to object to the State Governments recent notice of intention to change the method of voting in local government elections, from first past the post to a preferential system.

WALGA informs the State Government position was taken without consultation and contrary to the wishes of WALGA, local government Councils and the Local Government Advisory Board.

WALGA resolved on 4th October 2006:

That:

- 1. The Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) deplores the high handedness of the State Government in introducing the proposed changes to the current method of voting in Local Government elections without any consultation or communication with Local Government.
- 2. WALGA remains totally opposed to the proposed changes.
- 3. The proposed changes will politicise Local Government elections and are contrary to the good governance of local communities.
- 4. All Councils are encouraged to immediately write to the Minister for Local Government, local Members of the Legislative Assembly and Members of the Legislative Council opposing the changes and the actions of the State Government.
- 5. WALGA conduct a media campaign (including newspaper advertising) to raise community awareness about the implications of the proposed changes.
- 6. The State Government immediately justify the reasons for proposing the change and why the amendment has been introduced with such urgency, when it is contrary to the expressed wishes of WALGA, the majority of its member Councils and the recommendations of the Local Government Advisory Board.
- 7. All necessary Association resources be diverted towards campaigning to bring about a successful outcome to this issue.

WALGA writes:

"The Association now begun an intense advocacy campaign directed at the State Government's unilateral decision to impose proportional-preferential voting on Local Government elections.

The campaign includes advertising in all three media forms, meetings with key parliamentary players, and the engagement of legal and professional advice. An important part of our strategy involves initiating local government action at the local level.

One of the key aspects of the campaign is for Local Governments to express a lack of confidence in the Minister's handling of this issue. To this end we ask that your council consider, debate and pass the proposed "NO CONFIDENCE MOTION", set out below, at it's earliest opportunity.

Councils are also asked to write directly to the Premier, the Minister for Local Government & Regional Development and their local Members of Parliament, expressing their discontent with the Government's decision and asking that corrective action be taken.

Advice of the outcomes of your Council's deliberations would be appreciated, so that the Association can aggregate these motions and letters as an expression of sector wide dissatisfaction."

From an administrative perspective, the view of the Association is fully supported. Preferential voting has potential to promote the creation of alliances among those standing for Council, creating potential for an ongoing environment of factionalism within the elected body. Voter turnout to local government elections under the present, simple system of first past the post voting is already poorly attended and the introduction of a more complex voting system has potential to further deter voter participation. Informal voting in compulsory state and federal elections is affected by informal voting due to the complex nature of the preferential system, and this is likely to be mirrored if there is a change to the local government system of voting.

It is recommended the draft Motion of No Confidence and additional supporting actions suggested by WALGA be adopted by Council and that all efforts be made by this local government to assist the Association in it's campaign to ensure the retention of the present local government election voting system.

Passage of legislation containing proposed changes to the system of voting at local government elections will enforce a preferential voting system upon all future elections.
