- Senior Citizen of the Year (over 65 as of 26 January 2021) an older person you believe has delivered outstanding service to his or her community.
- Active Citizenship (group or event) a group doing outstanding work or for an event staged in the community during the past year.

The workshop was extremely well attended by 38 of our Eastern Wheatbelt tourism partners, tourism business owners and stakeholders, highlighting to TWA our passion about tourism in the Eastern Wheatbelt.

This was by far the largest number of workshop participants in any of the regional Deep Dive Sessions in the state to date. Everyone found the experience extremely worthwhile and well run by the Tourism WA presenter and there should be plenty of material for Tourism WA to go away and craft a 'Wheatbelt Story' from all the ideas and content gathered on the day.

#### **Rates Instalments Due**

A reminder that at the September Ordinary Council Meeting, Council adopted the following;

"That the due date for the 2020/2021 rates be amended to the 25th September 2020 with instalments becoming due on the 26th November 2020 (2nd Instalment), 27th January 2021 (3rd Instalment), and the 30th March 2021 (4th Instalment)."

The second instalment rates notices have now been posted out and are due by *Thursday, 26 November 2020*.

Rates instalments may be paid in person at the Shire Administration Building, over the phone, electronically with BPAY, by cheque or by making a direct transfer into our account.

Please contact the Shire if you are having difficulty making the payment dates. An interest rate of 5.5% will be imposed and legal action may be taken if payments are not paid by the due date.

# Actions to improve the water supply in Merredin

#### An update from the Water Corporation about efforts to improve your water supply


Water Corporation will begin work in November 2020 and go through to the end of January, 2021 to improve the water supply in Merredin town.

The main aspect of this work will be to replace sections of pipeline with buried pipeline along Bates, Todd, Snell, Queen and Barrack streets in Merredin.

The pipeline will be installed by a combination of open trench and directional drilling, which will be backfilled, compacted and restored.

Double L Construction, an authorised contractor, will be engaged to undertake this work.

#### Where is this happening?



#### **Hours of construction**

Work will take place between 7.00am and 5.00pm, Monday to Friday and some weekend work may also be required within these hours.

#### Will work impact me?

There will be some interruptions to your water supply when the replacement pipeline is connected to the existing service, however these interruptions will be planned with plenty of notice provided to local residences.

Businesses and occupiers will be notified by the Contractor before access to their property is affected.

### Wheatbelt Business Network Excellence Awards


