# **December Council Meeting**

The next Ordinary Council Meeting is scheduled to be held on Tuesday, 14 December at 4:00pm. This meeting will be held at the Shire Administration Building on the Cnr of King and Barrack Streets in the Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend. #### Merredin - Narembeen Road / Goldfields Road

Please be advised that there has been an issue identified with the seals on the Merredin – Narembeen Road and Goldfields Road. The issue is currently in the process of being rectified with the contractor, however temporary measures have been put in place in the meantime. Motorists are asked to please slow down and drive to the conditions.

#### **South Avenue Upgrades**

There will be road works completed along South Avenue, from Great Eastern Highway to Bruce Rock Road, during January 2022. The works are being completed by Main Roads, however, the Shire will be funding part of the project. Following the completion of the road works, the Shire will be replacing the kerbing along the road.

#### **CBD Project Update**

In addition to the 2.1 million dollars in funding received through the Building Better Regions Fund, the Shire of Merredin has now secured a further 1.6 million dollars from the Federal Government through the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure program. The total funding of 3.7 million has been allocated to the CBD Project including the creation of a town square and the upgrade of Apex Park.

At the Ordinary Council Meeting held on 23 November 2021, Council moved the decision to allocate additional funds to the town square project to ensure continued progress towards the construction stage. The Shire is expected to move forward to tender for the project once the final pieces of design are worked through with the project team.

At the same Council Meeting, Council nominated 1.1 million dollars of the Federal Government funding to go towards Apex Park, which has been identified as a top priority for the Merredin community. The plans for Apex Park will continue to be worked on over the coming months, with information to be released to the public once available.

Council have also approved the creation of a project manager position, which will ensure both of the above projects will continue to move forward as quickly as possible. Once this person is in place, we expect significant progress to be made.

#### Remembrance Day 2021

On the morning of Thursday, 11 November 2021 at 10.30, the flags located on the Visitor Centre lawn were lowered to half-mast.

Surrounded by a sea of red poppies, there was a sense of calmness as community members begun to fill the chairs onlooking the three flag poles that stood proudly side by side.

The service was officially opened at 10.47am with Shire President Mark McKenzie welcoming those in attendance and reading the commemorative address.

"Remembrance Day marks the anniversary of the resolution of the First World War..." he begun.

Originally known as the Great War, WWI was a conflict that left more than 9 million people deceased, of which 60,000 were Australian soldiers.

"Today, as we should every day, we remember those who volunteered, sacrificed, served, fought, and died for our freedom.

We thank you, and we salute you," Shire President McKenzie concluded before inviting forward representatives from Vietnam Veterans, Shire of Merredin, Merredin College, and St Marys, to lay their wreaths.



Aubrey Tompkin came forward to read The Ode before the familiar bugle sound of The Last Post rang throughout the Merredin CBD. At 11am, the crowd paused for a minute's silence to pay their respects to all of those who sacrificed their lives.

Moments later during the Rouse, an honour guard of three representing WWI, WWII, and Vietnam, raised the flags. The Australian and New Zealand National Anthems then played for the crowd to conclude the service.

The Shire of Merredin would like to thank all those who attended the Remembrance Day service. Lest we forget.



#### **Fire Danger Ratings**

Fire Danger Ratings (FDR) tell you how dangerous a fire would be should one start. The higher the FDR, the more severe a bushfire would be.

The Shire of Merredin has two FDR signs at the eastern and western edge of the Merredin townsite on the highway that are regularly updated. FDR for the region can be also viewed on the Emergency WA website - bit.ly/FireDangerRatingsWA

#### What do the ratings mean?

When the FDR is Low-Moderate or High, it generally means that any fires that start can mostly likely be quickly and safely brought under control. Very High means conditions will potentially be hot, dry and/or windy, and a fire may be difficult for firefighters to control. A FDR of Severe or Extreme means conditions are very hot, dry and windy, and if a fire starts it will be unpredictable, fast moving, difficult for firefighters to bring under control, and will be very dangerous for members of the public within the fire's proximity. Catastrophic FDR means conditions are the worst they can possibly be as far as fire safety is concerned. The only safe place to be in this situation is far away from the fire.

Finding out the FDR should be the first step in actioning your Bushfire Survival Plan. You should consider the rating when you decide whether to stay and actively defend your property or whether to leave early.

If someone you know tells you about a possible emergency, or if you can see or smell something that might be dangerous, that's your warning. Take immediate action to stay safe. Do not wait to receive a warning text message.

# Share what living in the Wheatbelt is like with doctors of the future

Two hundred medical students will be spending one week in the Wheatbelt in March 2022. During their stay, they will visit local farms, industry, general practices, hospitals and schools, and participate in community activities.

We need you to provide real-life experiences that will give them an understanding of what it is like to live in the Wheatbelt and perhaps inspire them to become rural doctors.

Students will visit the following towns:

## The University of Notre Dame Australia students

Bruce Rock, Merredin, Narrogin, Southern Cross and Westonia.

#### **Curtin University students**

Cunderdin, Corrigin, Kellerberrin, Moora and Wongan Hills.

As a host, we will ask you to provide bedroom/s for 2 or more students as well as breakfast and dinner (students can assist with this); live no more than 30 minutes from town and be

able to assist with transport to/from town; share what it is like to live in your town; and come along to a Thank You Dinner with the students.

## Why host?

This is a life-changing experience for the students, with many having no previous exposure to rural life or the Wheatbelt.

By providing these rural immersion opportunities early in their degree, it has been proven that students are more likely to explore rural career opportunities.

Some students continue to keep in touch and visit their host families, some return to do seasonal work and placements, others have joined mentoring programs, and some have inspired host family members to pursue tertiary studies in health and medicine.
