

Merredin's Christmas Gala Night

Hundreds of Merredin and Wheatbelt locals made their way down to the main streets for one of Merredin's biggest events of the year, Gala Night, held on Thursday, 16 December 2021. The event kicked off just before 6pm, with a demonstration by Merredin Youth Boxing, before Shire President Mark McKenzie officially opened the event on the main stage.

The streets were once again packed full with market stalls, entertainment, and amusements, and local businesses opened their doors for late night trading, welcoming customers until 9pm that night.

The electric atmosphere was ignited further by the wonderful local entertainment including Rural Dance, Merredin College Choir, Merredin Bootscooters, and Brother and I.

Children let loose in their designated silly string Leisure Zone, which returned to the program after being an absolute hit in 2020. Other activities included the shooting game, Pluck a Dino, Lucky Numbers, Mega Glow van, Burracoppin FC handball game, and the Dodgy Bros inflatable dodgeball arena (pictured below).

CBD Redevelopment Project

The Shire has now appointed a new Manager of Projects, Daniel Hay - Hendry. Daniel will be designing and delivering a number of Merredin's key priority projects for the community, including the CBD Redevelopment. In this position he will be working closely with stakeholders and contractors to ensure that the Shire's works projects are delivered smoothly and within allocated timeframes.

The design plans for the Pioneer Park upgrade are currently being finalised, with construction tenders expected to be released over the coming months.

Roads

In late 2021, the Shire identified issues with the seals on the Merredin - Narembeen Road and Goldfields Road. The roads are currently stable, but are being closely monitored by the Engineering department. Long term repairs will be made once cooler weather conditions allow.

Merredin Peak Toilets

The restoration of the toilets located at the Merredin Peak Reserve has now been completed and they are now open to the public. The project included the installation of two new toilets and hand basins, replacement of the front cladding to the building, and installation a water tank to allow for flushing.



South Ave Works

The kerb removal along South Ave has now been completed by the Shire, in preparation for the upcoming road works to be undertaken by Main Roads WA.

The new kerbing will be installed once the Main Roads WA portion of the project has been completed.

The Shire would like to thank the public for their patience during these works.

Main Roads WA Notice

On Monday 17 January, Main Roads will commence roadworks on South Avenue between the Great Eastern Highway and O'Connor Street. Works will be ongoing until the end of March 2022.


The condition of the road will be improved and vehicle noise reduced.

The northbound lane (on the school side) will be completed first and traffic will travel in two directions in the other lane (see map attached below). Whilst works are on this side of the road, access to properties on this side of the road will need to be via side roads. Works will then transfer over to the southbound lane.


During the works, access to Lenihan Park on South Ave will be closed.


COVID-19 Prevention Measures:

Future Home Care Services Initiatives

CEACA Inc currently owns and manages 71 independent living units ("Units") across 11 shires in the Central East Wheatbelt

region. These Units have proven to be very popular and they are fulfilling their original purpose of enabling the elderly or those living with a disability to remain living in their community, close to family and friends for longer, as well as assisting those on very low or low incomes to access affordable living options.

CEACA Members have formed a strategic plan for the future and one of the items is to look into the provision of home care services for not only our tenants, but those living in the community. The services that we are looking into include cleaning, gardening, shopping, transport, visits to family members, mobility solutions (e.g. handrails), occupational therapy and respite.

We are currently working with Catholic Homes and Baptistcare in relation to providing these services to the region. Both organisations have indicated a willingness to work with us on implementing new services or expanding on current ones. There are currently long wait times for accessing home care packages and the process can be very confusing and time consuming. This is why we recommend using a recognised home care provider to provide you with information and assist you through that process when you are ready to enter into a package.

There is no obligation to enter into an agreement with a home care provider if you do not feel you are ready or don't feel you need it, however being informed will prepare you for the future and avoid delays in accessing services when you need them. It is the right of every individual to choose the home care provider that best suits their needs and even if it is not one of the two organisations named above. Attending an information session will be beneficial for you to ask questions or to simply take notes.
