Review of Representation—Discussion Paper Open For Comment

The Shire of Merredin is conducting a review of its system of representation, in line with the Local Government Reform Proposals which are expected to be introduced into parliament in early 2023.

As part of this review, the Shire is seeking feedback on the Review of Representation Discussion Paper which has been developed to outline possible scenarios of change that may be introduced as part of these reforms.

The significant changes outlined in the paper revolve around the requirement to reduce the number of Councillors from nine, to between five and seven (including the Shire President).

Merredin Heritage Project Secures Funding

The Shire of Merredin is one of 38 successful recipients to share in more than \$1million in funding, through the State Governments 2022/23 Heritage Grant Program.

This program provides matched funding to heritage site owners for vital conservation works of heritage places, and funding assistance to local heritage managers to deliver interpretation projects that share the stories of our past.

Merredin will receive \$20,000 for the development and implementation of an interpretation plan for Pioneer Park and the Merredin Water Tower, inclusive of on-site, print and online interpretive materials. Please note, the Shire are working with the State Government to finalise funding for the refurbishment of the Water Tower. These works will not be completed with this grant.

Congratulations also to the Merredin Railway Station Group who also received \$7,712.00 in funding to develop an interpretation plan for the Merredin Railway Museum's Main Display area.

Summer Reading Challenge

During December and January, Western Australian Public Libraries are running an exciting Summer Reading Quest, including our very own Merredin Regional Library!

The Quest is open to children of all ages and runs until 31 January 2023, so it's not too late to sign up.

You can participate in the following ways;

1. Reading Log (ages five and over)


A calendar-style reading log to record the number of days and time read.

3. Summer Steps (ages five and under)

This is a thirty day Quest with fun literacy activities for little ones to do with family and friends. Pick up a Summer Steps card from the library and tick off each step as you complete it. Check in with your local Library once you have completed 10 steps for a small prize.

Corella Management Program

The Shire of Merredin has recommenced a Butler's Corella management program this month. Butler's Corella, are a declared pest in the Wheatbelt. The current large local population is causing environmental destruction, in particular long-term damage to trees that are important habitats for other species including the endangered black cockatoo. Corellas have heavily impacted biodiversity within the Shire and are causing significant damage to playing surfaces, native vegetation and infrastructure.

Road Works—Bulls Head Road

The Shire of Merredin have engaged a contractor to complete road widening works on Bulls Head Road, between Norpa Siding Road and Arnold Road.

The road works will take place from Tuesday, 17 January 2023 until Sunday, 22 January 2023.

Traffic management will be in place until project completion. Motorists are asked to follow all directional signage and allow for longer drive times.

Pioneer Park Car Park

The Shire closed the carpark located at Pioneer Park in late December to prevent damage to the road surface during the extreme heat. We are now working with the construction contractor to resolve the issue.

It is expected that the carpark will re-open within the next few weeks.
