Volunteering with the Emergency Services

Furthermore, there are so many jobs that need to be done that if you prefer not to be exposed to people with injuries, you could instead find yourself driving an ambulance for patient transfers between hospitals, operating the SES radios, rolling up hoses to go back on the fire truck, or assisting with administration or catering.


Welcoming a new member to the Team

Merredin Pool Awarded Gold 3 Years Running

The Merredin District Olympic Swimming Pool has been officially recognised as a Gold Waterwise Aquatic Centre for the third year in a row. The Shire of Merredin is one of 19 local governments across WA recognised last year, and the only pool in the Wheatbelt region to achieve gold status.

The Waterwise Aquatic Centre program is run by the Water Corporation in conjunction with the Leisure Institute of WA Aquatics, with the purpose of recognising local governments for their commitment to the implementation of water efficiency actions.

Please be advised that repair works will be taking place on Great Eastern Highway at Cohn Creek Bridge from Monday, 30 January 2023.

Tree Removal Works—Merredin-Narembeen Road

A Shire contractor will be completing tree removal works of select trees along the northern section of Merredin-Narembeen Rd from Monday, 13 February 2023 onwards.

These removal works will be in line with a clearing permit that has been approved by the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation.

The trees that will be cleared have been identified within this permit and are to be removed to make way for future road upgrades.

On completion, the Shire will be planting several new trees in the surrounding areas.

Traffic Management will be in place during the works and motorists are asked to follow all directional signage.

Drain Cleaning

The Shire has now commenced a staged drain cleaning program within the Merredin townsite.

This on-going program will include the removal of silt, debris and vegetation in sections of our open drain network.

There will also be a vacuum truck in town in the coming

weeks to clear portions of street drains and the pipe network.

Please note, due to the nature of the works there may be some noise and dust in areas where the works are being completed, however, we will try our best to minimise any impact to residents.

Merredin Tip Shop

The purpose of the Merredin Tip Shop is to encourage recycling within our community and reduce the volume of valuable items going to landfill. This tip shop will assist in building sustainable recycling practices by ensuring quality reusable items, are salvaged and recycled, therefore having a positive impact on the environment.

Items can be donated during regular landfill site operating hours and it is encouraged that community members bring any items that they wish to discard. These items must be safe and have the potential to hold value to other community members. The landfill site operator will approve items at their discretion after consulting the product acceptance criteria.

Bulls Head Road

Road widening works on Bulls Head Road, between Norpa Siding Road and Arnold Road have now been completed.

During these works, the road width was increased from 6m to 7m, to improve traffic flow and safety on the road.

Merredin-Narembeen Road & Goldfields Road

The Shire of Merredin has engaged contractors to complete reconstruction works on both Merredin-Narembeen Road and Goldfields Road.

The road works are scheduled to commence in late February/ early March 2023.

Traffic Management will be in place for the duration of the works and motorists are asked to follow all directional signage and allow for longer drive times during this period.
