IPWEA WA Excellence Awards

The Shire of Merredin has won three awards at the annual Institute of Public Works Engineering Australasia WA Excellence Awards held on Friday, 10 March 2023.

The IPWEA Awards showcase high calibre projects from both local government and public work sectors that demonstrate excellence in engineering and innovative practices.

The Shire received the Excellence in Innovation Award (Regional) for the Standalone Reuse Water Irrigation System – Merredin Cemetery, a Best Public Works Project less than \$2M (Regional) Highly Commended Award for the Pioneer Park Revitalisation, and the Emerging Young Leader Award which was presented to the Shire's Executive Manager Engineering Services, Lindon Mellor.

This is a fantastic achievement for the Shire's Engineering team who consistently demonstrate a hard work ethic, show a drive for innovation and sustainability, and are committed to delivering high standard projects for the Merredin community.

Harmony Week Celebrations

The Cummins Theatre hosted more than 180 people for the annual Merredin Twilight International Food Festival on Friday, 24 March 2023, which was held in celebration of Harmony Week.

The event opened with a Welcome to Country by Mick Hayden, followed by a speech by Shire President Mark McKenzie who spoke about the importance of coming together and celebrating our nations diversity.

“This year the key message of Harmony Week was ‘everyone belongs’, which is an important message to convey as Australia is one of the most multicultural places in the world. Here in Merredin, we are exceptionally lucky to have a diverse range of cultures and religions represented within our community,” he said.



After being cancelled in 2022 due to COVID-19, the International Food Festival returned with much success, with 16 volunteer cooks offering a taste of 21 delicious dishes. Dishes included Biryani and Samosas from India; Shakshuka from Morocco; Portuguese Tarts from Portugal; Pineapple and

Chicken Fried Rice from China; Koeksisters, Vetkoek and Mince, Melktert Shooters and Boerwors Sausage from South Africa; Tiramisu, Pumpkin Gnocchi, Ravioli and St Joseph’s Pastries from Italy; Tablet from Scotland; Sushi from Japan; Chilli from Mexico; Brownies from America; Kangaroo Kebabs and Rissoles, Damper, and a Sausage Sizzle to represent local Aussie’ cuisine.

Performances on the night included fantastic renditions of Disney’s Be Our Guest (from Beauty and the Beast) and the South African Zulu folk song Siyahamba by A Choired Taste (pictured below), as well as a selection of Italian music by musicians Etta and Josh who performed throughout the evening.



RFT 01 2022-23 Merredin Water Tower Conservation Works

The Shire of Merredin is seeking suitably qualified and experienced consultants to complete the detailed design and construction works associated with the conservation of the Merredin Water Tower.

The deadline for submissions is 10:00am AWST, on Tuesday, 2 May 2023. Late submissions will not be accepted.

Submissions are to be received via TenderLink.

Underground Drain Cleaning

Underground drain cleaning around the Merredin CBD will be taking place this month, with the expected commencement date to be Monday, 17 April 2023.

These works will be completed in two stages; from 17 April 2023 until 21 April 2023, and from 1 May 2023 until 5 May 2023, however these dates may change depending on the weather conditions.

It is expected that there will be some noise and dust in the area while the drain cleaning is completed.

Traffic management will be in place for the duration of the works and motorists are asked to follow all directional signage.

Road Works—Goldfields Road

The Shire of Merredin have now completed reconstruction works on Goldfields Road, which commenced in February 2023. These reconstruction works included a new seal, reconstructed cement stabilised pavement, and improved drainage.

These works are part of the Shire's on-going Regional Road Group funded program valued \$675k.

Road Works—Merredin-Narembeen Road

The Shire of Merredin has now engaged a contractor to undertake the next portion of reconstruction and resealing works on Merredin-Narembeen Road.

These road works are part of the 5-year Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network project valued at \$5.7 million which will see a total of 24km of Merredin-Narembeen Road upgraded. This program commenced in 2021/22 with 7km completed, and we are now entering year 3.

This year will see an additional 8.3km of road upgraded, as well as the widening of the culvert bridge closest to the highway.

Information relating to traffic management will be provided closer to the date.




VISITOR CENTRE

Gift of Life Baton Arrives in Merredin

The Gift of Life Baton, an Olympic style torch that will be gifted to the World Transplant Games Federation following the 2023 World Transplant Games, arrived in Merredin on Thursday, 13 April after a 4300km journey from the Gold Coast.

The Baton was transported via motorbike by a team of four from Gold Coast charity The Pride of Bettermen and Lionesses, including altruistic donor Gordon Ruty.

The motorbike ride was held to promote the need for more Australians to register as organ and tissue donors while promoting the beauty and rawness of Australia to an international audience through the World Transplant Games.

The Baton symbolises the gift of life that is given from donor to recipient, and features the World Transplant Games logo, and is engraved with the words, "Thank You."

The convoy were welcomed to Merredin by Shire President Mark McKenzie, St John representatives Jay and Jasmin, Councillor Romolo Patroni, and Chesney Maloney (who will be competing in the Games for Australia) and her family.

What is the new process?

- 1 You complete a PATS application form and include any requests for consideration outside the current guidelines.
- 2 You submit your PATS application form in person, by post, fax or email to your local PATS office.
- 3 Your application will be assessed internally by WACHS. Your GP may be contacted for additional information, as required to support the decision.

FIRE SAFETY

The first of April is the day the Department of Fire and Emergency Services traditionally reminds us, “Don’t be a Fool, Check Your Smoke Alarm”, so let’s have a chat about smoke alarms.

Working smoke alarms save lives, there’s no two ways about it. A small fire only needs a few minutes to engulf a room, and a house can be beyond saving before the fire brigade can even get to the scene.

1. Does my house even have smoke alarms?

Hardwired smoke alarms are now required by law in all residential buildings prior to sale or rental, but if your house has been in your family for a long time, you may not have them. There are a good number of electricians in Merredin who will be able to install hardwired smoke alarms for a comparatively low outlay. If the budget can’t stretch that far at the moment, you can buy battery powered smoke alarms for less than the cost of a meal out for two.

2. How old are my smoke alarms?

Smoke alarms should be changed every 10 years. After this time, your smoke alarms won’t work as well due to dust, insects and corrosion of electrical circuits. If it’s been longer than 10 years since you’ve had your smoke alarms fitted or replaced, give one of our friendly local electricians a call about replacements.

3. How do I test my smoke alarms?

Hold down the test button on your smoke alarm until you hear the loud alert tone, and then release.

4. How do I clean and maintain my smoke alarms?

At least once a year make sure you:

- ▶ vacuum around your smoke alarm vents with a soft brush attachment to remove dust and cobwebs;
- ▶ use a surface spray around the smoke alarm (but do not spray inside the smoke alarm) to prevent insects nesting inside;
- ▶ replace the battery, if you have a 9-volt user-replaceable battery.
