#### **MERREDIN COMMEMORATES LONG TAN DAY**

At 4:00pm on Sunday, 18 August 2024, community members gathered at Reflection Pond in Roy Little Park to honour Vietnam Veterans on Long Tan Day. The ceremony, attended by approximately 40 people, commemorated the 58th anniversary of the Battle of Long Tan with solemnity and respect.

Mal Willis began the proceedings by reflecting on the historical significance of the Battle of Long Tan, before paying tribute to Jim Willcox, a local veteran who passed away in February 2024. Willis's emotional tribute highlighted the profound impact of Willcox's contributions on the Merredin community.

Wreaths were laid by representatives of the Wheatbelt Vietnam Veterans, the Shire of Merredin, and Churches Fraternal before Vietnam Veteran Aub Tompkin stepped forward to read the Ode. Aubs' moving recitation added a deeply reflective element to the ceremony.

The Shire of Merredin extends heartfelt thanks to all who attended and contributed to making this event a meaningful and respectful tribute.


#### CBD REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT UPDATE



Lighting has now been installed in Apex Park | Danjoo Waabininy Boodja, while additional softfall has been added to the Exercise Equipment area and the Ninja Warrior Course. Minor rectification works are being carried out to ensure all elements meet the highest standards of quality and completion.



The Town Centre is due to be completed with in the next few weeks, with the last major element, the events structure, due to be completed by 30 September. The Barrack & Bates St intersection will be closed from Tuesday, 24 September - Friday, 27 September to allow rectification works to take place.

#### MERREDIN UNVEILS REVITALISED PARK: A NEW HUB FOR COMMUNITY AND VISITORS

The Shire of Merredin is pleased to announce the official re-opening of Apex Park | Danjoo Waabininy Boodja, following an extensive six-month redevelopment. The beloved community space, which has served as a central gathering place for families and young people, has been transformed into a vibrant, multi-generational play and recreation area that celebrates Merredin's unique environment and rich natural history.

Commencing in February 2024 and completed in August 2024, the park's redevelopment culminated in a grand opening ceremony on Wednesday, 7 August 2024. Shire President Mark McKenzie and Hon. Darren West MLC had the honour of cutting the ribbon in front of hundreds of community members, including students, local business owners, Shire Councillors and staff, Merredin traditional owners, and representatives from Lotterywest and surrounding Wheatbelt Shires.

The redesigned park now features a brand-new skate park, half court, a variety of new play elements including a flying fox and slide tower, and the addition of wheelchair-accessible play equipment. Complementing these features are beautifully landscaped areas and enhanced amenities, all designed to increase the park's appeal to families and young people, ensuring inclusivity and accessibility for everyone in the community.

Shire President Mark McKenzie expressed his enthusiasm for the park's reopening, stating, "Apex Park has long been a cherished space in our community, and this redevelopment ensures that it will continue to serve as a place of enjoyment, connection, and recreation for generations to come. We are proud to see how the park now reflects our community's vision and our commitment to providing high-quality, inclusive public spaces."

The park's opening follows the Council's decision to retain the name "Apex" as a tribute to the local APEX group who originally built the park. In addition, the Council has introduced the dual name "Danjoo Waabininy Boodja" to honour Merredin's Indigenous heritage. This name, meaning "Coming Together (community) Playground," symbolises respect for history, the celebration of diversity, and a commitment to inclusivity.

The new park, which has been in the pipeline for twenty years, now stands as a vibrant public space that will serve as a hub for recreation, relaxation, and community gatherings. It is also expected to provide significant social and economic benefits to Merredin and the surrounding Wheatbelt region, reinforcing Merredin's position as a key regional hub.

The transformation of the park was made possible through the generous contributions of Lotterywest, which provided \$2.1 million in support, and the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) program, which contributed \$1.8 million. The Shire of Merredin extends its sincere gratitude to these partners for their support in bringing this project to life.

Lotterywest CEO Colin Smith said this grant supports the revitalisation of the park, which is an important space for the local community.

"Lotterywest is proud of its support of more than \$2.1 million to the Shire of Merredin, which has enabled the redevelopment of this much-loved community space," Mr Smith said.

"Places like Apex Park are important in building a stronger sense of belonging and participation, which aligns with Lotterywest's vision for a more connected community life."

While the major redevelopment works have been completed, some minor works within the park are still in progress.





#### **WESTERN POWER NOTICE**

Providing a safe and reliable supply of energy is important to us, and so are you! We're carrying out essential maintenance and upgrades in your area as part of our ongoing commitment to enhancing network reliability and resilience to weather events.

Western Power is returning to Merredin to complete our maintenance program. The work will be concentrated in the Merredin townsite from Monday 7th of October to Friday 11th October 2024 (this timeline is subject to change for network emergencies, weather conditions, unplanned faults, or other technical reasons). The main carpark for IGA and the town shopping area will be impacted during this time. However, the IGA will be open for business.

We will need to schedule some power outages to do the work safely. If you are impacted, you'll receive notification of any required outage in advance. Please check your notification carefully. We understand that the planned work may cause some short-term inconvenience, but we expect that these upgrades will bring improvements to reliability of power supply to the Merredin community. #### SUCCESSFUL GRANT APPLICATION

#### SHIRE STAFF TURN A NEAR MISS INTO A MIGHTY SAVE

Last month, Shire staff stepped in to help this stunning Peregrine Falcon, after it was struck by a car doing 110 km/h and became stuck in the grill. Despite the severity of the incident, the falcon miraculously survived. Quick-thinking staff members carefully extracted the bird from the car's grill and placed it in a cardboard box, where it was kept in a darkened meeting room to reduce stress. The local wildlife rescue organisation, Bluebush, was promptly contacted, and the falcon was handed over to them for further care.

Thanks to the swift actions of our team and the dedicated care provided by the local wildlife carer, the Peregrine Falcon is now on the mend. We are hopeful for a full recovery and grateful to everyone involved in giving this magnificent bird a second chance. If you come across injured wildlife, please contact your local wildlife rescue organization for assistance.





In a major boost to water safety education, the Cook Labor Government has announced free VacSwim lessons for children across Western Australia during the December and January school holidays. This initiative is part of a \$5.5 million investment in school swimming lessons and water safety programs, designed to ease financial pressure on families while providing essential skills for children.

Premier Cook said, "We want our kids to learn the importance of water safety, as it is incredibly important in Western Australia, which is why we have removed financial barriers to help drive increased participation.

It represents up to \$214 in savings for a family with two kids enrolled in a 10-day VacSwim program over the December and January school holidays."

#### **RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD**

We are now in the Restricted Burning period which means no burning will be able to take place unless you have been issued a permit.

Permits will typically only be extended to those on rural properties with no other practical way to reduce their fire fuel loads.

The Restricted Burning Periods are: 16th September 2024 – 31st October 2024 18th February 2025 – 16th March 2025


