Merredin Audit, Shire of Risk and **Improvement Committee are seeking expressions** of interest from individuals who would like to be considered for the roles of 'Independent Chairperson' 'Independent and Deputy Chairperson' of the committee.

The appointment process will consider the qualifications, skills and expertise required for the functions of the Audit, Risk and Improvement Committee. Exposure to local government is not essential but will be highly regarded.

the Committee is currently comprised of five Elected Members, however this will reduce to four in 2025. Changes to the Local Government Act require the Committee to have an Independent Chairperson. The Audit, Risk and Improvement Committee meets approximately four times a year, though may include additional meetings as required.

Each member must attend in person and ensure they have capacity to adequately consider the Agenda papers prior to each meeting. In adherence to relevant legislative requirements, members will be eligible for reimbursement of reasonable expenses relating to their duties.


