A message from Xinyi





Casual Cleaner

Applications are invited for the position of Casual Cleaner with the Shire. This role will provide casual cleaning services at Shire of Merredin facilities, community buildings and public amenities, when required. In this role you will be responsible for maintaining immediate cleanliness and routine cleaning to ensure facilities are maintained and well-presented during hours of operation through adherence to cleaning roster duties.

Working in conjunction with other Shire staff, this position is key to ensuring the facilities are clean and well maintained to meet the expectations of patrons, when usual cleaning staff are unavailable. Ideally, we are looking for someone who takes pride in their work, is flexible with working hours, is available at short notice and has some experience in commercial cleaning.

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS AND FIRE BLANKETS

Fire extinguishers are great to have around the home – if a small fire starts, correct use of the correct type of fire extinguisher can ensure you get on top of it before it grows and does serious damage. However, using the wrong kind of fire extinguisher can be dangerous and make the situation worse.

There is no single fire extinguisher that will work on every type of fire. However, if you're looking for a multipurpose fire extinguisher for around the home, choose an ABE dry powder extinguisher. You will be able to recognise it by the white stripe on a red extinguisher, and it should also be labelled "ABE" ("BE" powder extinguishers are different and have different capability, so make sure it definitely says "ABE").

ABE dry powder extinguishers can be used on:

- w solid fuel (like a fire in a paper bin, or if curtains behind a stove catch fire)
- bliquid fuel (like a small puddle of petrol or diesel but NOT cooking oils or fats)
- w a fire started by or involving electrical equipment.

ABE dry powder extinguishers CAN NOT be used on cooking oils or fat fires. It is therefore useful to also have a fire blanket in your kitchen. There are multiple retailers in Merredin who sell both fire extinguishers and fire blankets at affordable prices.

Using fire extinguishers and blankets

Fire extinguishers and fire blankets are both very simple to use – however, most people use them for the first time during an emergency, which is not ideal.

If you have to use a fire extinguisher, remember the acronym PASS:

Pull the pin

Aim at the base of the fire

Squeeze the handle to start the extinguisher

Sweep the extinguisher from side to side until the fire is extinguished

Fire & Rescue NSW have a good video on YouTube demonstrating how to use a fire blanket, and there are several reputable fire safety organisations with videos on YouTube demonstrating how to use a fire extinguisher. Take 5 minutes to have a look at these videos and familiarise yourself with the process.

If you have access to a fire extinguisher at home or work, practise holding it, get a feel for the weight, and identify where the pin and the pressure gauge are. You can practise the fire blanket technique with any blanket or towel you have around the home.

Remember!

Fire extinguishers and fire blankets should only be used on small fires. If you feel unsafe, or that the fire is too big for the extinguisher or blanket, get everyone out of the building immediately and call 000.
