Legislative Requirement

For Council to provide formal consent to the Water Corporation (WC) for the installation of a new section of pipeline and creation of an easement on Reserve 18613.

### Background

The Shire of Merredin (the Shire) has received correspondence from the WC seeking consent from the Shire for the proposed installation of a new section of pipeline and the subsequent creation of an easement over the pipeline once installed. These works will improve the reliability of the Goldfields & Agricultural Region Water Supply Scheme (the Scheme).

Reserve 18613 is Crown land vested in the Shire for the purpose of Public Utility under the Shire of Merredin Local Planning Scheme no 6. (LPS).

### Comment

The scheme supplied by the WC has played a vital role in sustaining residential, agricultural, and industrial activities across the region since its commissioning in 1903. To improve the reliability of the Scheme, a new water main is required to replace a section of the existing water main. These upgrades are required to continue to support development, and to ensure a safe and reliable water supply in the Goldfields and agricultural region.

The WC are now seeking formal confirmation from the Shire with respect to the creation of the proposed easement which will enable WC personnel to install, access, maintain and protect the proposed new section of pipeline.

### **Impacts**

### **Environmental**

The proposed development is in proximity to residential dwellings. The WC should be reminded of its obligations to carry the proposed works in the most sensitive manner, especially in proximity to dwellings. A response to the WC should mention the fact that Council expects that rehabilitation works will include removal of building matter, leveling of soils, replacing landscaping, and fixing infrastructure that is damaged during construction (like roads etc).

Compliance with the Shire of Merredin Local Planning Scheme No.6.

The land in question is located at Reserve 18613 its current purpose being Public Utility under the LPS. The proposed installation and operation of pipeline renewal and associated easement complement the existing use of the area.

Although the WC is not a government department, it performs the functions of a public utility and should therefore be exempt from being required to lodge a Development Approval (DA) application.

The reasons are that:

- a) Section 6 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005* says that the Act should not interfere with public works, and
- b) the Deemed Provisions (cl 61 (1)) exempt 'Maintenance and repair works' providing they are not within a heritage area.

The Deemed provisions are not clear regarding what 'repair works' means, so it is taken on face value and that it is not referring solely to residential repair works.

The request letter states that it has - or will - contact the owners where the works are on private land.

Attachment 13.1A - Draft Letter to Main Roads WA

## Purpose of Report **Executive Decision** Legislative Requirement

To seek Council's endorsement to forward a letter to Main Roads Western Australia (MRWA) raising concerns regarding the current condition of the Great Eastern Highway between Northam and Merredin, and to request advice on what actions MRWA intends to take to ensure safety and efficiency along this transport corridor.

# **Background**

Council and the community have expressed increasing concerns regarding the deteriorating condition of the Great Eastern Highway between Northam and Merredin. The highway is the primary freight and passenger route through the Eastern Wheatbelt and is vital for agricultural produce, freight logistics, and regional travel.

Observations and complaints have highlighted:

- Numerous potholes and pavement failures creating unsafe driving conditions.
- A rough road surface causing driver fatigue and vehicle wear.
- A lack of sufficient overtaking lanes leading to unsafe overtaking manoeuvres, particularly with heavy vehicle traffic.

The matter is of heightened importance given the continuing growth in truck traffic and the pending harvest season, which will place further pressure on the highway.

### Comment

It is proposed that Council formally write to MRWA to highlight these issues and to request;

- 1. Immediate maintenance to address potholes and failed road sections;
- 2. Advice on longer-term plans for pavement renewal and highway upgrades;
- 3. Consideration for additional overtaking lanes to improve road safety; and
- 4. Confirmation of MRWA's priorities and timelines for improvements on this corridor.
