MERREDIN SERVES UP SUPPORT AT 'R U OK?' COMMUNITY LUNCH

The Merredin Town Centre became a hub of community connection as locals gathered for the R U OK? BBQ Lunch on Thursday 28 May. Hosted by the travelling R U OK? Conversation Convoy, the event commenced at 11:30am, drawing community members young and old together to focus on the importance of meaningful conversations and mutual support.

Attendees were treated to a free sausage sizzle lunch, kindly cooked by the Conversation Convoy team, then were able to enjoy an array of lawn games including giant Jenga and cornhole, alongside dedicated checkers and chess tables. These activities offered a welcoming space for residents to pause their daily routines, connect with one another, and reduce the stigma surrounding mental health discussions.

The 43 local residents in attendance gained valuable insight into the specific mental health services available within the Wheatbelt region. Free resources and practical toolkits were distributed, equipping attendees with the confidence and knowledge to effectively check in on family, friends, and colleagues.

The exceptional turnout reflected strongly on the local community. The R U OK? Conversation Convoy team extended their sincere gratitude to the people of Merredin, noting that this gathering was one of the best-attended weekday events they have hosted on their tour. This impressive participation is a credit to the local residents, demonstrating Merredin's commitment to community wellbeing.

Thank you to the R U OK? team for bringing these essential resources to the region, and to the community members who supported the initiative.

DIGITAL LITERACY BOOST FOR LOCAL SENIORS

The weekly Seniors Tea and Tech Program continues to make a meaningful impact within the community, providing local seniors with the opportunity to build confidence and skills in using modern technology in a supportive and welcoming environment.

The program has been proudly supported through the Age-Friendly Communities Connectivity Grants Program, funded by the Department of Communities. This financial support has enabled the delivery of practical and engaging technology sessions tailored specifically to the needs of local seniors.

Throughout the program, participants have taken part in a range of informative sessions designed to improve digital confidence and everyday accessibility. Topics included cyber security awareness and scam prevention, navigating the Emergency WA app, using the online IGA shopping app, accessing and navigating various aspects of the Shire website, and learning how to book tickets and register for events online using QR codes and website links.

In addition to group sessions, the program has also provided individual one-on-one support, allowing participants to receive assistance with personal devices, applications, and online tasks at their own pace.

Attendance numbers and ongoing community feedback have clearly demonstrated that this program has been highly valued and greatly needed by locals. Many participants have reported increased confidence in using technology, improved access to online services, and a stronger sense of connection with both community information and family networks.

SHIRE PROJECT UPDATES

King Street Bridge Closure

Please be advised that the King Street bridge (located between Duff Street and Growden Street) is closed until further notice due to structural foundation damage.

While the Shire has been closely monitoring the bridge, it has now reached a point where a closure is necessary as a precautionary measure to ensure public safety.

Our infrastructure team is currently sourcing quotes from contractors to begin remediation works as quickly as possible. In the meantime, motorists are kindly asked to seek alternative routes. We appreciate your patience and cooperation.

Road Updates

The roads crew has completed the widening and resurfacing project on Chandler-Merredin Road, and is also nearing completion of the resurfacing of St Mary's carpark. Attention has now moved to the Crooks Road works, with the construction team completing final grading and road works in preparation for surface stabilisation and laying of bitumen in the coming weeks. Once this is completed, we will move on to our winter grading program on the unsealed road network.

ASBESTOS DISPOSAL

The Shire of Merredin has strict rules aligned with WorkSafe and the Department of Environment Regulation to keep our community safe. Here is what you need to know before you dispose of it.

Do I Need a Licence?

- Under 10m² (Non-friable): You can remove it yourself without a licence, but you must follow all wrapping and disposal rules.
- Over 10m² (Non-friable): You must hire a licensed professional or hold a Class B WorkSafe licence.
- Friable Asbestos: (Crumbles easily, like insulation). This always requires a Class A licence.

When and Where can I Dispose of Asbestos?

Disposal is permitted exclusively on Thursdays at the Merredin Landfill Site. You must book an appointment in advance by calling the Shire Office on (08) 9041 1611, and all relevant disposal fees must be paid for your load to be accepted.
