


## Regional Arts Fund Recipients Announced

Member for Durack Melissa Price has announced the latest round of projects to receive funding through the Regional Arts Fund.

“Cummins Theatre Merredin has received \$10,700 for Small Voices through the same program. This project will engage professional community artist Alex Desebrock to allow those in the Merredin community who have the smallest voices – children – to be heard by a wider audience.” says Melissa. “Through a series of multi-disciplinary arts workshops with visiting and local artists, participants will explore their thoughts for the future, and how they see their world. The project will culminate in a public exhibition of work which will be accessible to the greater community in a variety of local venues, and aims to start discussions about what it means to be a part of the Merredin community today and into the future.”

The Australian Government provides assistance through a number of programs in addition to the Regional Arts Fund to support the creation and delivery of high-quality and creative work for Australians living in regional and remote areas to enjoy. Each financial year approximately \$3.3 4 million is provided to the Regional Arts Fund to support sustainable cultural development in regional and remote Australia.

The Shire of Merredin's Annual Report 2015/16 is now available for viewing online or in hard copy format.




## New Website for Visitor Centre

## Free After Hours GP Phone Service

A free after hours GP advice service has been made available for people in the Mid-West, South-West, Wheatbelt and Goldfields. The 1800-CALL-A-DOC service is being trialled in country WA over summer to help with increased demand for medical services over the holiday season.

The service is for people who can't get to a doctor at night or on weekends. Experienced, Australian-based GP's can provide advice, diagnosis and prescriptions for a range of telehealth-suitable conditions such as fever, vomiting, dehydration, cold and flu, pain and certain infections.

Acting Regional Development Minister Brendon Grylls said the service was now live and available outside the greater Perth metropolitan area, in the five southern WA Country Health Service regions of the Mid-West, South-West, Great Southern, Wheatbelt and Goldfields.

The 1800-CALL-A-DOC trial is a partnership between Telstra's ReadyCare health arm, the WA Primary Health Alliance and the WA Country Health Service.
