## 'Destination Merredin' Evolution

#### Thanks Merredin for Your Feedback

The Shire of Merredin has recently been making a lot of noise on social media and via other platforms about a four year major review of it's Strategic Community Plan (SCP). This ten year plan sets the strategic direction for the aspirations of the Merredin community. It is created through feedback from members of the community and details the aspirations of the community as a whole for the next ten years. It is reviewed every four years to check off milestones achieved and set new ones based on feedback received.

A great deal of feedback was received during the review period and the Shire would like to extend it's heartfelt thanks to those who participated. Merredin should have a plan that reflects the aspirations of it's community across it's many spectrums and the Shire is pleased to report that it received a lot of input from across a very broad range of areas from various community groups and individuals.

The manner in which this feedback was received was via a booth installed at the Merredin Show, two public forums held at the Library on Wednesday, 21 March, a visit to the secondary students at Merredin College where they were asked to fill in a simple 3 question survey, via the Wheatbelt Business Network which kindly assisted in asking some of Merredin's business owners their thoughts and aspirations for Merredin's future and through an online website platform know as Loomio where the Shire asked the Merredin community to discuss a series of three different questions.

Going forward this feedback will now be reviewed and analysed by independent facilitators. A summary of the key findings and the draft plan will be made available for public comment prior to the adoption of the new plan. The adopted plan will then be made available to the public through the Shire website or paper copies will be available from the front counter.

## **Twilight Food Festival**

Palak is an amazing Indian cook. She might not be a household name but newly arrival to Merredin in 2017, she has been working locally and entertaining her friends with her delicious Indian cuisine. Last year at the Gala Night she set up a juice stall with her friend in front of the IGA. This year she says she is very excited to do it again. It's not only to get people to sample her cooking but also to meet the community members for which she has a high regard. Palak represents much of what the Food Festival is about: a celebration of the culinary and cultural diversity of Merredin.

The Festival was held on the 16 March 2018. Coinciding with the Merredin Show the following day proved advantageous with different visitors arriving for the Show also taking the time to visit the Festival. From small beginnings this event has certainly gained traction and a once small get-together has grown and evidently is forming into a rich celebration of cultural diversity that is our Merredin community.



The event is a fusion of "old meets new" through food and the people that participate in the cooking. The festival highlights the growth of different cultures in the area, as well as interest in ethical cuisines such as hickory smoked beef by Greg and Ben - an emerging trend and tradition of pit bosses and the like.

We had a little trouble in finding willing participants for the festival however found out that it has its own momentum. People just love getting involved and showcasing what it means to be Swiss, German, Spanish, Scottish and Bangladeshi.

There is a consistent theme of sharing knowledge. Ordinary people have amazing cooking stories. The human connection and eating together is also pivotal. You can learn how to do anything on the internet but people want that connection. As the saying goes "they want to break bread together".

Without volunteers and additional funding these events would not have been possible. Thank you to Lotterywest, Collgar and the many volunteers that helped set up Cummins Theatre and cleaned up after the event. Last but not least at the very heart of this festival is a huge thanks to the community members who cooked their national cuisines for tasting. The Shire of Merredin hopes to continue this collaboration with many great ideas from our local cooks and the community.


