What is a 5 minute Fire Chat? Have you had the discussion with your friends and family of what you would do in the event fire? Bushfires are unpredictable and happen every year. The single biggest killer is indecision. To survive a bushfire you must be prepared to make your own decisions. Head to https://www.dfes.wa.gov.au/firechat/Pages/default.htm to have your 5 minute fire chat. What about your pets? An estimated 63% of households in Australia have at least one pet, one of the highest rates of pet ownership in the world! It is vital that you include your pets in your emergency plans. You can find out how at the DFES website under the 'safety information' tab.

Storm Safety: Storms can occur all year round and it is important to have yourself, family and property prepared. Residents can minimise this damage by taking a few steps to prepare for winter storms and stay Storm Safe. Dog and cat owners should make sure their annual registration is renewed by 31 October.

The registration period runs from 1 November to 31 October.

All dogs over the age of three months must be registered and wear both a registration tag and disc showing the owner's phone number and animals name.

Similarly, all cats six months and over must be registered and wear a registration

As of 1 November 2015 all dogs and cats must also be microchipped prior to the renewal of their registration.

Owners of unregistered cats and dogs can incur a \$200 on the spot fine and an infringement of \$200 for unchipped animals.

Access Update



- 1053 roads were endorsed under HMMS Road Lists for the 2018-19 harvest period.
 Onsite assessments are underway with the intent to add these endorsed roads to the relevant RAV Networks prior to
- the upcoming harvest period.

 This eliminates the need for future special access arrangements under HMMS.

Key Points

- ◆ No changes to the HMMS
- Apply for new RAV access early, allowing up to 12 weeks
- HMMS access is now via RAV Networks or Restricted Local

New RAV Access

RAV Access Options

- Use a Category 1 RAV vehicle combination that is 20 m or less in length and 50 t or less in gross mass on any road.
- Use a RAV that is greater than a Category 1 RAV vehicle combination on approved RAV Network roads.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITY

Have you got a local infrastructure proiect that you want funded? The Federal Member for Durack, Melissa Price has announced a new grants program as part of a \$22.65 million national investment under Round 5 of the Stronger Communities Programme.

What is it? There is \$150,000 worth of grants money to fund up to 20 local small capital projects in the electorate of Durack.

How can I apply? You can apply for grants ranging from \$2,500 to \$20,000 for projects that demonstrate social benefits and will improve community participation. Head to melissapricemp.com.au , fill out an Expression of Interest form before Friday 6 September 2019 to be eligible.

How long have you been working with the Shire of Merredin?



The Merredin Dog Park will officially open it's doors to wagging tails on 12 October 2019 from 10am-12 noon.

Dog owners and park users alike will benefit from a new enclosed dog park on the corner of Coronation & Bates Streets Merredin, after the Shire acquired grant funding to assist with this project.

The new facility will enable dog owners to exercise their pets off-leash in one of two completely separate areas, one for large dogs and another for small dogs.

Enclosed dog parks have been well received in other local government areas where they have been trialled. This dog park will be a terrific community health initiative.

Enclosed dog parks give people space to socialise their dogs, which can result in less conflict in parks and happier dogs that are less likely to develop behavioural issues, such as excessive barking or digging.

The dog park features high perimeter fencing, a gate entry system, agility features, watering points, shade and different surfaces to cater for a range of dogs.

Majority of the funding for this project has come from the Shire of Merredin, Collgar and Lotterywest. The Shire would like to thank the Merredin Men's Shed and Avon Youth for their assistance in the construction of the Dog Park equipment.

All dogs entering into this area are required to be compliant with the *Dog Act 1976* that requires dogs to be registered and chipped. Failure to do so may result in penalties. All dogs outside the perimeter **MUST** be leashed.
