


FIRE BREAK INSPECTIONS

The Prohibited Burning Period (NO BURNING) is now in effect as of November 1st. As such, annual fire break property inspections have commenced to ensure that each property owner has complied with their Fire Break Orders.

Where you have been found to have not adequately complied with your Fire Break Orders, you WILL BE ISSUED with an infringement notice without any warning via post. The penalty for failing to comply with your Fire Break Orders is a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 and the person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work outlined in the Fire Break Notice 2019/20.

Children / Senior season pass: \$130


Family season ticket \$325 (2 adults* and up to 4 children)

Under this initiative your child will be refused entry into the pool if they have not been at school without a legitimate reason.


