Household Hazards Drop Off Event

13 June 2020, Shire of Merredin Depot

Do you have any unwanted chemicals and hazardous materials stored in your home or shed you need to dispose of safely? Come along to the Free Drop off Day in the Shire of Merredin!

There are a number of hazardous items in your home, which must not go in your kerbside collection bins. Safely dispose of paint, pesticides, herbicides and poisons, pool chemicals, household and garden chemicals, flammable liquids, gas bottles, fluorescent tubes, household batteries and more for free on Saturday 13 June. The Shire of Merredin Depot on Telfer Avenue in Merredin will be taking collections between 10am—12pm

What can be disposed of at the event?

- Acids and alkalis
- Aerosols
- Batteries (household)
- Engine coolants and glycols
- Fire extinguishers Non halon (red) only
- Flammables
- Flares
- Fluorescent lamps and tubes (CFLs)
- Gas cylinders (small household)

- Paint
- Pesticides/herbicides
- Poisons/toxics
- Pool chemicals
- Smoke detectors
- Unknown chemicals must be in sealed, chemical resistant containers.

Limit 20kg or litres per material type. Only domestic waste will be accepted (no commercial, business or farm waste).

This event is open to residents of any Local Government. You do not have to live in the Shire of Merredin to drop off your household hazardous waste.

RANGER NOTICES

Impound Times

Where a dog is seized and detained and the dog is wearing a registration tag or is microchipped, (or the owner is readily identifiable), the Shire Ranger will issue a seizure notice to the registered owner. The dog is to then to be kept and maintained for a period of at least **7 days** following the issuing of the seizure notice.

Where a dog is seized and detained and the dog is not readily identifiable, the dog is to be kept and maintained for a period of at least **72 hours** following the seizure and impound of the dog. Please ensure your dog's microchip and registration details are up to date to ensure the safe return of your dog.

All dogs impounded by the Shire of Merredin Ranger that are not readily identifiable will be posted to the Shire of Merredin Facebook page.

All fees, including registration (if not registered) shall be paid prior to the release of the animal. Any animal not claimed within the time period advertised will be transferred to the A1 Wheatbelt Dog Rescue for adoption.

Restricted Burning Period

The Restricted Burning Period is currently in effect until the 16 March 2020. As such, burning permits are required and can only be obtained from Fire Control Officers in your area as listed on the Shire of Merredin website.

Any special conditions stated on your permit or imposed by the permit issuing officer must be strictly adheard to. The permit holder shall give notice of his intention to burn to the owner or occupier of adjoining land.

Any incinerator used to burn rubbish must be properly constructed. An open drum with or without a lid is not an appropriate incinerator.

A REMINDER TO DOG OWNERS...

A reminder to all residents that not picking up your dog's poo is considered littering and under the *Litter Act 1979*, you could incur a fine of \$200 for not cleaning it up in public areas such as parks and streets.

WHY THERE IS AN ISSUE?

Droppings contain harmful bacteria such as *Toxocara Canis*, a roundworm found in infected dog faeces which can be passed on to humans and cause infections. Children, people with compromised immune systems, and field sports players are most at risk of infection.

Private Pool Inspections

Western Australian Law requires Local Governments to inspect private swimming pool and spas for safety and compliance at least once every four years. Letters will be sent in the next few months to owners whose pools are due for inspection.

We ask owners to contact the Environmental Health Officer within seven days of the date of the letter to make an appointment for the inspection.

Local Governments are empowered to enter property and undertake inspections at any time however we prefer to inspect pools by arrangement with the owner.

Inspections can be booked at a time between: 8.30 am and 5.00 pm Monday to Friday.

The Building Act 2011 and Building Regulations 2012 state that private swimming pools and spas with water more than 300mm deep must have a compliant barrier installed. This is intended to help in the prevention of drowning deaths and injuries of young children under the age of 5 years

The Shire of Merredin appreciates your assistance in booking your inspection as it is a vital part of ensuring that residential pools and spas are safe and protect young children in our community.
